AIW currently reports on its Scope I, 2 and 3 emissions. These detail AIW's total annual energy use of electricity, gas and transport fuel. Effectively, this is AIW's carbon footprint within the United Kingdom. We take numerous measures to reduce usage including scheduling plant and machinery to turn off when not in use and utilising plant and machinery to furn off when not in use and utilising on office lighting which are set to the lowest timer.

AJW Group is committed at every level, from the top down, through our customers and suppliers. Sustainability is a global issue and will only succeed if we all commit to trying.
